## 2. PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES

The principal activities of Brighton Connection are those of carrying out the objects set out in the Constitution, namely:

- a) To promote and develop community programmes for the betterment of the neighbourhood heartlands.
- b) To promote relationship enrichment within families; between parents and children; spouses; and intergenerational family members.
- c) To provide community assistance to all kinds of people groups in the heartlands, particularly, the poor and underprivileged.



for Life initiative and conducted monthly digital enrichment workshops to equip the seniors with basic digital skillsets benefiting up to a total of 50 seniors.

4) Youth work has gained much traction within the MacPherson community. The current attendance for Youth Mentorship Programme on Mondays is about 10 to 15 on a weekly basis. 'Sporty Tuesday' for youths continues to attract an average of 2 to 3 new youths weekly and has a regular attendance of about 12 youths weekly. In total, we have a reach of over 20 community youths on a regular basis. For Youth Mentoring Programme in secondary schools, Yuying Secondary School has engaged us once again for their new batch of students. We have also started a new contract with Bukit Panjang Government High to conduct workshops and activities twice weekly over 40 weeks. We have reached out to and engaged a total of up to 40 youths for both schools.

During the period, Brighton Connection conducted a wide range of programmes, including several new and innovative activities, to serve the community.


